



YOUTH GRANT PROGRAM

ELIGIBILITY: Open to original enrollees of The Tatitlek Corporation (TTC) and lineal descendants of original enrollees (by birth or adoption). The Copper Mountain Foundation provides grants to promote Tatitlek Corporation shareholder or descendant youth participation in programs which promote education or preservation of Tatitlek Native culture and traditions, art, history and language.

AMOUNT: Grant awards may be up to \$1,000 per program per year. Grants larger than \$1,000 will require board approval. Payment will be made directly to the school or program providing the youth activities or supplies and cannot be made directly to any student or parent. Reimbursement of program expenses is not permitted.

HOW TO APPLY: Complete the youth grant application and provide the following documents with the application:

- Descendant Registration Form (if needed)
- Program Description (Syllabus, Brochure, Itinerary etc...)
- Verification of Enrollment (Enrollment document, award letter, enrollment confirmation email, etc...)
- Personal Statement and Optional Photo (250 – 500 words) (See Guidelines in Attachment A)

Attachment A: Personal Statement Guidelines

1. Introduction: Who are you? Start by introducing yourself. Provide your name, where you're from, and your current grade. You might also mention something unique about yourself, like a passion or sports, to help us get to know you.
2. Background: Tell us about your background. Explain a bit about your life, family, and community. How has growing up in your village/city, your cultural heritage, or your family influenced you?
3. Career and Education Goals:
 - o What do you want to do after high school? Share your dreams and goals for the future. Do you have a career in mind or a specific field you're passionate about? For example, if you're interested in health care, engineering, cultural studies, or environmental conservation, tell us why.
 - o How will this program or grant help you? Think about how this grant will make a difference. Will it help you pay for college, a trade school, or a special program? Will it help you gain skills that will prepare you for your career? Be specific about how you see this grant making an impact on your future.
4. Passion for the Program or Field:
 - o Why are you excited about this field or program? What about the program interests you the most? For example, if you want to study marine biology or cultural preservation, explain why that field is important to you personally. Maybe it connects to your culture or community, or maybe it's something you've been passionate about for a long time.
 - o How does this program connect to your community? If applicable, talk about how your future goals align with helping your community or preserving your culture. If you envision using your education or skills to give back, describe how.
5. Closing: What are your hopes for the future? Finish by explaining what you hope to achieve in the long term and how receiving this grant would help you move closer to those goals.
